The District also provides equal access to its facilities to the Boy Scouts and other patriotic youth groups, as required by the Boy Scouts of America Equal Access Act.

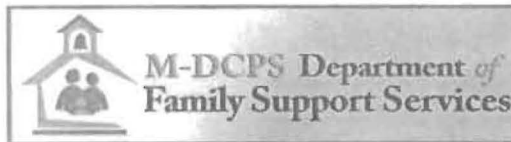

PHP Overview

Parents-Helping-Parents (PHP) is a parent outreach project provided by the district to the families of the most vulnerable students attending selected schools implementing the Title I Schoolwide Program. The primary goal of this initiative is to increase meaningful parental involvement by: enhancing parents' understanding of the policies impacting their children; perfecting their advocacy skills on behalf of their children; and learning to effectively share information and support with other parents at the school. The project is managed by the M-DCPS Department of Family Support Services, a new department created as a Millennial Access Platform and aligned to the Vision 20/20 Strategic Blueprint. *The Parents-Helping-Parents* project will be phased in at all schools implementing the Title I Schoolwide Program over a three year period.

The Central Florida Parent Center (CFPC) is a non-profit agency that supports agencies providing parents of children and young adults with all disabilities and special needs in central and northeast Florida with accurate information, interactive training, quality assistance, and empathetic support. In addition to Parents-Helping-Parents, CFPC helps to implement "Sharing the Commitment" (STC), a collaborative effort in Collier County Public Schools. This groundbreaking project has made a significant impact in the Collier County schools for the past 16 years.
